

# About Rosie's Place

*Rosie's Place is grateful to the volunteers, friends and supporters who truly make an impact on the lives of more than 12,000 poor and homeless women a year in the following ways:*



We serve more than 100,000 nutritionally-balanced breakfasts, lunches and dinners annually in our warm and cheery dining room.



Rosie's Place Groceries enables 1,800 women per month to take home 20 to 40 pounds of foods that their families prefer and enjoy.



Rosie's Place's Advocacy staff schedules close to 1,100 appointments with guests each month. Advocates assist with housing, educational and employment opportunities, clothing, wellness care, transportation and emergency funds for eviction prevention and medications.



Approximately 300 women each year find sanctuary in our emergency housing, while advocates work with them to find permanent homes and services they need.



Our Outreach program works to break the cycle of chronic homelessness by providing monthly in-home supports to 120 guests who are at risk of becoming homeless.



Our Outreach Van provides services and support weekday evenings to as many as 500 women per month on the streets of Boston.



The Women's Education Center helps 350 women each semester improve skills and increase self-sufficiency through free ESOL, computer and literacy classes and one-on-one tutoring.



Our Wellness Center provides 6,000 guest visits each year for blood pressure and blood sugar screenings; assessment of health problems such as colds and flu; chiropractic and alternative interventions; and immunizations.



Our Legal program provides more than 650 consultations with attorneys, who can help guests with housing, family, immigration, employment, debt and benefit matters.



At our satellite office at Franklin Field public housing development, over 1,000 residents participate in Rosie's Place-led activities each year. We offer advocacy, outreach, legal and job assistance, support groups and food pantry to families in one of the city's most underserved neighborhoods.



We connect with up to 500 at-risk families with children attending Boston schools through on-site outreach, housing assistance, food pantry and advocacy services.



Our Community Health Program works intensely with 20 guests who suffer serious or chronic health conditions, assisting with medical appointments, health insurance, prescriptions and support.

Rosie's Place relies solely on the generous support of individuals, foundations and corporations and does not accept any city, state or federal funding. We are proud to ensure that 88 cents of every dollar raised goes directly to essential services for our guests.
